Illegible entries will not be processed and will be shredded. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the club will add a \$30 processing fee to the amount of each returned check.

Portuguese Water Dog Club of America, Inc. is accepting online entries through www.LabTestedOnline.com. Create a user account and add your dogs. Then look for the trial on your My Local Events page or search by state. Click on the “I” information icon to the right of the club’s name to create your entry. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows: 150 online entries and 200 paper entries per day. If either form of entry (paper or online) has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either accordingly.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the **Judge of Record** PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24” height division. However, if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present; **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog **before** its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor’s responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

NEW Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog’s jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in.

AWARD INFORMATION

Placement rosettes will be given for 1st through 4th place in each jump height in each class. Dark green qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score. Rosettes and ribbons will only be awarded for qualifying scores. The Club reserves the right to substitute prizes of equal or greater value. All prizes must be claimed the day of the trial—none will be mailed.

High in Trial will receive a special award.

MAXIMUM ENTRIES PER ENVELOPE

A maximum of 10 entries per envelope is allowed. Envelopes with more than 10 entries and/or entries received prior to the opening date will be returned.

MIXED HEIGHTS & CLASSES

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

FEO & FIX N GO

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

FEO allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is now offered in all classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring. Toys must be non-audible and may not leave the handlers hand. Toys that roll freely may not be used.
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and/or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

Fix and Go On

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the run.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Telegraph, telephone and fax entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms or Entry forms without the Agreement and Rules on the reverse side of the form are not acceptable. Unsigned Entry Forms cannot be accepted nor entries which specify any conditions as to its acceptance. Entry Forms MUST be filled out completely. Incomplete entries do not constitute a valid entry.

Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors, & no entry will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after published closing date. PLEASE PRINT OR TYPE CLEARLY. **NO STAPLES OR TAPE PLEASE.**

Portuguese Water Dog Club of America, Inc., the trial secretary, their agents, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors or their dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility

for injury to children not under the control of their parents or guardians.

IF IT IS NECESSARY TO RESCUE A DOG from a parked car on the show grounds, the Club will not be responsible or liable for any damage to the car involved.

Owners or handlers entering dogs in a trial do so at their own risk and agree to assume responsibility for any damage caused by them, or by their dogs. They also agree to abide by the Rules of the American Kennel Club and the current edition of the AKC Agility Regulations.

The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all the obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such cases, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The club has no responsibility to provide services to locate the dog. **If you are not present, you will be marked absent.**

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four (4) months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

MOVE UPS

Written requests for dogs to be moved-up to a higher class, as a result of qualifying for an agility title, will be accepted at the trial secretary's address until **6:00 pm on the Monday before the trial**, and will be included in the running order. Day-to-day move-ups will be accepted but must be received by the Trial Secretary no later than 15 minutes after the last run of the day. All Move ups require a fully complete AKC move up form.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. Entry fee will not be refunded in the event that the dog is absent, disqualified, excused, pulled from the event after closing or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee or if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of civil disturbances, fire, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Bitches in season are not eligible to participate in agility trials. Any exhibitor with an entered bitch in season, on the trial date, will be refunded the entire entry fee (each day), upon written certification from a veterinarian. Notification must be provided to the Trial Secretary no later than 30 minutes before the start time of the event on the date of the trial.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION AND WARM-UPS

The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered only in that class.

SETUP

All classes will be held under cover on dirt rings of approximately 100 x 100. There is plenty of crating space under cover. Crates may be left overnight, but exhibitors do so at their own risk. Electronic timing will be used.

FOOD

The World Equestrian Center has numerous food centers on site.

SAFE SPACE

The AKC is committed to creating a safe and respectful sport environment for all.

HIGH in Trial Agility Award

High in Trial (HIT) agility award is offered at the National Specialty. The National Specialty day is determined to be the second day of a two day trial. The HIT award will be determined from the classes held on Tuesday, October 6, 2026.

Double qualifying scores (QQ): qualifying in both standard and jumpers with weaves on the same day will be considered first for HIT and the PWDCA Approved rules applying to the Standard class. In the event of a tie, a runoff will be held.

Scores from the Preferred class will not be considered for HIT.

The following formula has been approved by the PWDCA Board of Directors and will be used at future National Specialties to calculate HIT Agility.

First consideration for HIT are those teams with qualifying scores in both standard and jumpers with weaves on the same day. For each classes there is a handicap system. Masters and Excellent level dogs get 30 points, Open level dogs get 20 points and Novice level dogs get 10 points per qualifying score.

At the end of Standard and JWW classes, all QQs will be considered first across all jump heights. If there are no teams with QQs those with a qualifying score in the Standard class are selected. A record is made of that dog's name and number, their score, the Standard Course time for their course and the dog's course time. Standard course times vary from each class level and each jump height. Next, calculate the difference of the dog's actual course time under standard course time (rounded). For example, if the SCT is 63 seconds and the dog runs the course in 58.3, then the difference is 4. Next, add the dog's score (100,95, whatever) to the difference in time (in this case 4) and add the handicap (30 for M/Ex, 20 for Open, 10 for Novice). If this were an Excellent level dog, the calculation would look like this: Dog's score + 4 + 30 = dog's total points.

To determine HIT, first look at teams with QQ's; if none, move on to dogs with scores of 100 in the Standard Class. If there are no dogs with a perfect score of 100, then you move down to the next highest score and calculate the other qualifying dog's score.

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice **height division** for all **Regular** titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or *back-to-back trials only*. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM** be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
